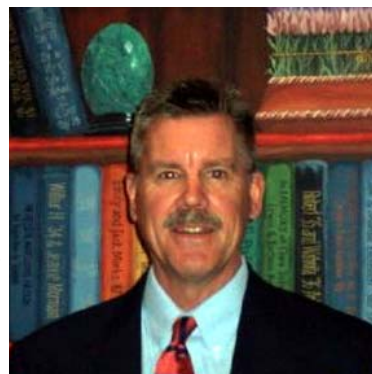


From the OACRAO president

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Shake ‘em Up and Knock ‘em Down in Toledo!

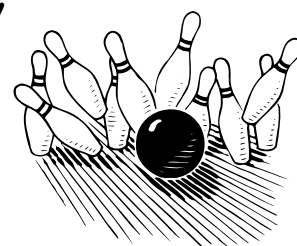

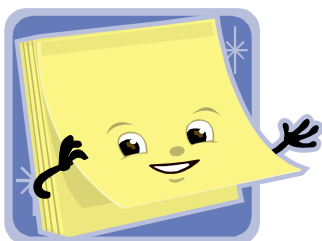
From Treva Hanseman, Vice President—Programs

Management and Business Process Re-engineering. This change will fully integrate our student services offices, including Admissions, Registrar, Financial Aid and Financials.

We have had many changes at **Defiance College** in recent months. We have renovated Dana Hall to accommodate a computer lab for our new computer forensics major. Also renovated was the science building with new labs and lecture room on the third floor.
