Elbert W. Ockerman State and Regional Professional Activity Award





Chris Dorsten accepts Ockerman Award for Ohio Summer Institute Gov. Mike DeWine released his <u>recommendations</u> for the state's next budget on Friday, March 15. This is just the first step in the fiscal years 2020-21 budget process, as the budget now goes to the state legislature. In an effort to engage and inform OACRAO members around government relation matters, I will highlight some of the governors interesting higher education-related proposals.

### Certificate programs and "micro-degrees"

The state would fund "micro-degrees" for at least 10,000 Ohioans a year at a cost of \$15 million each year. These micro-degrees are low-cost, industry credentials that typically take less than a year to finish.

### Financial Aid, Tuition, Grants, and Scholarship Funding

Tuition guarantees would be a requirement for the state's public universities.

Funding for the Ohio College Opportunity Grant would be increased by \$47 million over the biennium. The state would also expand funding for the Choose Ohio First Scholarship, the National Guard Scholarship and the War Orphans Scholarship programs.

According to the state Department of Higher Education, the proposed budget includes an increase of nearly \$50 million in need-based financial aid for college students over the next two years and an additional \$24 million in support for student scholarships in science, technology, engineering, mathematics and medical careers (STEMM).

Randy Garner, Ohio's newly appointed Chancellor of Higher Education, reacted favorably to Dewine's state budget proposal for colleges and universities. "After 33 years in the General Assembly and 16 budgets, this may be the most student-focused state budget I've seen for higher education," Gardner said in a news release. "This budget centers on affordability while helping prepare Ohio for a fast-changing economy and high-quality jobs through workforce preparation, more need-based financial aid, and strategic scholarships."
