This year as we developed the conference program we found an abundance of sessions related to the transfer experience. These have been concentrated into a Wednesday "track" for conference-goers who wish to understand best practices and explore the transfer student experience from recruitment to full integration into the college or university community.

The Transfer Experience in Ohio

Today's transfer students arrive on our campuses with an eclectic assortment of prior learning experiences. Regardless of their background, these students face a variety of challenges as they transition between our institutions and attempt to transfer in work taken at the secondary level such as AP and CTAGs. How we prepare our institutions to welcome transfer students will ultimately help to alleviate the student frustrations that negatively impact the college experience. Join us for a workshop where you will gain knowledge on Ohio Department of

Higher Education (ODHE) initiatives "alphabet soup," focus on the benefits of Transferology, and understand the importance of course applicability. Workshop topics include:

- Ohio Department of Higher Education colleagues will provide OACRAO with the latest innovations, updates, and budgetary insights as a new biennium plan and administration evolves. The aged TAGS and AP will be explored as well as the newbie PLA and CBE initiatives.
- Ohio Northern University demonstrates use of Transferology and ways of evaluating transfer credit. Promote a smooth transition for students by establishing good relationships and improving communication with offices involved in the transfer process.
- The federal government has come out with new regulations regarding which courses will count toward a degree for financial purposes. Find out the latest regulations, best practices, the impact on all students, and the special challenges posed for veteran students.

Redefining the Transfer Visit Experience

When it comes to visiting campus, a transfer student is looking for a unique perspective. They don't just want to know about the university and what it has to offer to all students, but they want to know about how the university can accommodate them and their prior experiences. When it comes to visiting a university, transfer students want to know how their credits will transfer, how their prior experiences are going to apply to their major, and not only what the university looks like, but also whether or not they are going to find community at their new institution. Join us as we show you how to redefine the transfer visit program, encourage you to share your own experiences, and leave you equipped with the tools and ideas to improve your transfer visit and craft a unique experience that leaves a transfer student not only comfortable with the university, but also the transfer process.

Home at Last -- Creating a Transfer Community Starts with Ambassadors

Concerns about the transfer process go far beyond whether credits transfer or whether or not a student will graduate within a reasonable time. In fact, one of the key concerns of many transfer students is whether or not their next school will be the right fit for them. Transfer students are looking for a community to belong to at their new institution, something a traditional visit to campus may not convey. Often, tour guides and student ambassadors who started as first-years know little about the transfer experience and have trouble relating to a transfer student and their time at another institution. Join us as we outline a new transfer student ambassador program aimed at building community among current and future transfer students.

Interpreting the Code: College Credit Plus and Residency

The attendees will learn how Columbus State Community College works with the 4,000 College Credit Plus students. A number of the students are classified as non-Ohio residents. The Office of the Registrar and the Dual Credit Office have a systematic process to ensure that the students are correctly classified per State of Ohio regulations.

Transfer on Demand

The demand for instant feedback and results has infiltrated all aspects of our lives. In an ideal world, the transfer admission and enrollment process would involve an immediate and perfect symbiotic relationship between admission, the registrar, and advising. However, in the real world, we know that too often and with so much on our individual plates, it can be difficult to create this immediate and seamless process. Join us to learn about a new initiative called Transfer on Demand that provides Admission staff with real time assistance from the Office of the University Registrar with credit evaluations, answers to questions about course equivalencies, tips on navigating the student through the institution for further evaluation of elective credits and ultimately improves the customer service experience for prospective and admitted transfer students.

ell us about yourself: Melanie Hough...

What do you do at Ohio Northern University?

I am the University Registrar at ONU. Our office handles records, registration, curriculum building, athletic eligibility, transfer credit evaluation using TES and Transferology, Nat'l Student Clearinghouse reporting, Degreeworks, graduation audits, catalog changes, and course building, just to name a few.



How did you come to your current position?

I began my career at The University of Findlay in 1981 as a secretary in the Physical Plant. I went to school and earned my BA in Business Admin. and an MBA. I went from secretary, to Accounts Payable Supervisor, to Director of Degree Completion. I was at UF for almost 22 years.

I left there to move to South Carolina when I married my husband. While living in South Carolina, I worked as a Program Director in the Distance Education office of UNC-Charlotte. From there, I was offered a position as Campus Director of the new start-up Pennsylvania Campus of Mountain State Univ (out of Beckley, WV). After about a year and a half, my husband was offered a position in Louisiana, so we moved there about 2 weeks before Hurricane Katrina. We didn't stay long! We made a pact that the first one of us who found a job out of there would lead us on our next adventure. I found a job as an Assistant Registrar at Pfeiffer University's Charlotte, NC campus. From there, I took a job at Indiana University - Kokomo (my husband was raised in Lafayette, IN). After about a year and through some networking, I decided to change positions to Registrar of the Indianapolis campus of Ivy Tech Community College. I wanted to try my hand as registrar at a school with a large (35,000) student population. I was there from 2007 to 2013. But, I had grandchildren back in Ohio, so when the position at ONU was advertised, it was perfect! Not only a good school that I was familiar with, but also just 30 miles from my hometown and the grandkids.

Did you attend the October 2016 OACRAO Conference? Yes What did you take away from it?

It was great to learn that I am not alone in my struggle to adapt our system and our campus to the preferred name. The people are amazing and I really loved the networking. The 2016 conference was my first conference even though I have been at ONU since 2013.

Outside of work, what do you like to do?

When I am not at work, I enjoy gardening and art projects (everything from drawing to refinishing furniture).

Are you originally from Ohio?

Yes, born and raised in Findlay. But, I have lived in Gaffney, SC, Aliquippa, PA, Charlotte, NC, Natchitoches, LA, Kokomo, IN, and Pittsboro, IN.

What is on your bucket list?

Teaching arts/crafts after I retire to groups such as senior citizens or youth groups, visiting Yellowstone, and visiting the Grand Canyon.


