LINUS J. RYLAND AWARD

Last month I wrote about Garland G. Parker, a leader in our profession and namesake of the Garland G. Parker award. Check out this letter from Garland Parker to Linus Ryland where Garland humbly agrees to let OACRAO give an award in his name. Little did Linus Ryland know that he too would come to have an OACRAO award that included his name.

Linus Ryland started as a Systems Analyst at Miami University in 1975. Prior to that, he served for three years as a field representative for a US Congressional Representative. He was active in local civic life and had earned a master's degree in education from Xavier University. Linus served as President of OACRAO in 1987 and presided over the annual meeting held that year in Oxford at Miami University. Sadly, Linus passed away in 1995 at the age of 56. That fall the first Linus J. Ryland award was presented to Fr. Clarence DeRuntz.

Like Garland Parker, Linus Ryland also served as a mentor to others in our organization. Dave Sauter, retired university registrar at Miami, shares his story of how Linus got him involved in OACRAO: "Sometime early in my registrar career, Miami Middletown, 1984-91 as Director of Records, Registration, and Advising, I was talking to Linus while in Oxford -an every Thursday trip I made from Middletown due to position responsibilities. I was looking to get involved in OACRAO, and so Linus "on the spot" invited me to a meeting in Columbus. That started my OACRAO connection, which continues strong to this day. A funny sidenote was that Linus offered to drive, so we met in a parking lot of the then-Holiday Inn at the Middletown exit on I-75. I left my car there, he drove, the meeting ended, we drove back to Middletown. Pulling into the parking lot, we saw that the entire parking lot blacktop had been re-sealed, and there sat my car in the midst of it all. We laughed...a good early memory."
