2015 OACRAO Conference



Save The Date: Ohio Values Veterans - Train The Trainer Program

The Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE) was tasked with developing a “statewide training program that prepares faculty and staff of state institutions of higher education to evaluate various military training, experience, and coursework...” (ORC 3333.164). In order to provide an on-going training program the ODHE Military Strategic Implementation Team (MSIT) has partnered with the American Council on Education (ACE) to create a train the trainer program this fall on September 23rd and October 21st! The Ohio State University has graciously agreed to host the train the trainer event in order to provide a central and convenient location.

Each institution should plan to send one to three faculty/staff members to both of the train the trainer workshops. To ensure that each institution sends a small team, we are asking Chief Academic Officers and Provosts coordinate team registration. The first sessions will provide the training needed and the second session will allow campus teams to present the information back to the overall group. This information will then be used to further enhance the Ohio Values Veterans Toolkit.

ATTENDEES: Public institutions of higher education are encouraged to send teams of 2 to 3 faculty or staff who are in a position to coach and equip other faculty and staff on their campuses with information and tools related to awarding college credit for military training, experience, and coursework. These individuals will be responsible for coordinating and facilitating campus training programs related to military credit.

PURPOSE: To ensure that appropriate equivalent credit is awarded for military training, experience, and coursework . . ." (ORC 3333.164C) by providing an opportunity to equip institutional representatives with the training and tools necessary to familiarize their faculty and staff members on their campuses pertaining to awarding of college credit for military training, experience, and coursework.
