What do you do at Zane State College?

I am Assistant Dean for Curriculum & Alignment/Registrar, which is too long of a title! I currently oversee the management of the Registrar's Office and Veterans Affairs, which includes registration, scheduling, program degree audits, veterans' certifications, transcript processing, transfer equivalencies, data management, records management, grades, commencement, and diploma processing. I also manage the college's curriculum development, revision, and approval processes and college catalog. I am responsible for assisting with articulation agreements and serve as the institutional coordinator with ODHE for statewide transfer initiatives. Our office has two other full time employees (Assistant Registrar and Academic Records Specialist) and several student workers.

How did you come to your current position?

I began at Zane State College in 2009 as Director of the Transfer Program and part of my duties included serving as institutional coordinator for our statewide transfer equivalencies for the college, evaluating all general education transfer work, and managing our articulation agreements. This morphed into an assistant dean role,

where I also took on the duties of managing our curriculum processes and overseeing our college catalog. Due to restructuring last year, I was asked to take on the additional role of Registrar. It's been quite a learning process and I am grateful to have had the OACRAO listserv and conference to help me along the way!

You attended the October 2015 OACRAO Conference at Maumee Bay State Park in October.

Any highlights about the conference?

My first OACRAO conference was a wonderful learning experience! I learned a great deal from everyone and am grateful to my mentor, Brad Myers from Ohio State University, as well as my "unofficial" mentor, Sun Jamerson from Lorain County Community College. This was clearly the most useful conference I have ever attended and am looking forward to the next one.

Outside of work, what do you like to do?

I enjoy travel and have had wonderful opportunities to travel throughout the USA and abroad. One of my most memorable experiences was being selected to teach a six week Summer Intensive English program conducted by Ohio State University at Wuhan University in China (where this photo was taken) and to travel throughout China during my stay. I formerly taught ESL at Ohio University and one thing I miss is interacting with international students.

Are you originally from Ohio?

I am originally from a suburb of Cleveland, but our family moved to a small farm in beautiful southeastern Ohio when I was young. I have also lived in Athens and am now settled in Zanesville. I lived briefly in Florida (they said no snow, but didn't tell you about the brutal heat and humidity of summer); I decided Ohio was more for me in the end!




Tom Westendorf began his career at University of Dayton in 1982 working in Athletics and Human Resources. It was the summer of 1997 when the Registrar's Office at the UD was in a self-proclaimed 'stuck in the past' situation, when Tom Westendorf stepped up to the plate and took the opportunity to lead his staff/team to what would prove to be many victorious seasons and semesters.

Under Tom's guidance, UD led the way in the transition to a paperless (or at least a much-less-paper) world. No easy fete for an office whose mere title conjures thoughts of stacks of grade reports, registration forms, drop/add forms, academic transcripts and graduation applications.

Serving during the turn of the millennium and beyond, Tom spearheaded the coming of the electronic age to campus. Under his leadership, the university became one of the first universities in the nation to pilot web registration, and university catalogs went online. An in-house degree audit system was developed as well, all in the midst of two major campus-wide software conversions.

Sixty-four graduation ceremonies later, Tom says he credits his "really great staff" for all he was able to accomplish in his years as UD's Registrar. Tom's retirement date is March 31, 2016.
