BYLAWS UPDATE

The Bylaws Committee carefully reviewed the Bylaws and have the following recommendations for amendment:

- We propose using the enrollment data based on the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) rather than self-reported enrollment data for determining dues and the number of voting members per member institution. This is following the practice of AACRAO to use IPEDS data.
- Clarifying that honorary members are not voting members.
- Clarifying that Institutional Members may designate non-voting members in the non-voting members section.
- Adding Section 8 Membership Benefits. Membership Benefits are referenced in the Bylaws, but not defined anywhere.

The detailed draft of the Bylaws with recommended changes identified has been sent to the OACRAO listserv. If you have questions or comments, please do not hesitate to contact Deb Benton, Chair, Bylaws Committee, or any of the committee members, David Schneider and Frank Yanchak. These recommendations will be discussed at the annual conference during the Town Hall Meeting and will be voted upon at the Business Luncheon.
