Of the 1900 total individuals in attendance, I especially enjoyed seeing the large contingent from Ohio who were in attendance this year. The 103rd Annual meeting was highlighted by engaging and inspiring keynote speakers. The meeting opened with a humorous, engaging, and occasionally off-color plenary session led by master storyteller, Garrison Keillor. Keillor is a writer and humorist best known for his radio show *A Prairie Home Companion* which is featured on more than 600 public radio stations each week. His unique blend of comedy, charisma, and wisdom was charming and fun, and AACRAO attendees both laughed and cringed as he weaved through his stories.



The plenary session on Tuesday was truly inspiring, as AACRAO was joined by father and daughter Wayne and Nicole Maines, who shared their family's journey which was recently featured in the best-selling book, *Becoming Nicole: The Transformation of an American Family*. Nicole, a current




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

Tell us about yourself!

It has been my honor to have served as the Registrar for fifteen of my twenty-four years at Columbus State Community College (CSCC). The Office of the Registrar at every institution is a mission critical unit that is a foundation of services and processing. During my tenure as Registrar, I saw the need to bring my community college colleagues together to discuss issues and develop solutions. In 2013, I founded the Ohio Community College Registrars (OCCR). The next OCCR Annual Meeting will be held on Friday, May 26, 2017 on the Columbus State Community College campus.

What do you do at Columbus State Community College?

The work I do as a member of a highly-skilled team of higher education professionals changes the lives of the individuals we serve. Serving a diverse population of more than 26,000 students gives us an opportunity to meet the needs of veteran/military students, single parents, middle/high school students, transfer students, those in the workforce, students from many different countries as well as many other groups. In addition to generally supervising a department of 20 professionals, I chair the Academic Calendar Committee, co-chair the Gender Identity Task Force, lead the Ellucian Colleague Academic Records/Registration/System Set-up, represent CSCC on three Ohio Department of Higher Education Committees and serve OACRAO as chair of the Governmental Relations Committee.

I’m the immediate past local chapter president and through the ParentLINKS program tutor a student at Trevitt Elementary School. 
Are you originally from Ohio?
