
MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

What do you do at Union Institute & University?

I am the advising module manager, responsible for creating and maintaining the degree audit for our students. I review and approve each student's transfer record and plan for degree completion. I also work with our deans and program chairs in determining the transferability and applicability of non-native credits in individual cases or in the drafting of academic and articulation agreements with other organizations. In addition, I serve as UI&U's Principal Designated School



Official, advising our foreign students on Department of Homeland Security regulations, and maintaining our certification with the DOH's Student and Exchange Visitor Program.

How did you come to your current position?

I started out at Union as a Program Advisor for undergraduate students in our business and management programs. After a couple of years of helping our students navigate their degree programs, a transfer credit data entry position opened up in the Registrar's Office and I jumped at the chance. I had been patiently waiting for my chance to join that team for months when the opportunity came. The work suited me as well as I thought it would so I stuck around, taking on several different roles and responsibilities over the years.

Did you attend the October 2016 OACRAO Conference? What did you take away from it?

Simply enter your ideas for sessions or presenters in the Google form with as much detail as possible. Your ideas will be passed along to the appropriate committee for further development. We want to collect as many session ideas as we can before the meeting. Give us a head start and submit your session ideas no later than March 6.

Help us to provide you with substantive and relevant sessions. The brainstorming we do in February and March *before* the Planning Meeting will significantly impact the quality of our program in October. Start those creative juices flowing, fill up the idea hopper, and make the Planning Meeting the palooziest ever!
