
Jack Campbell says farewell to Wittenberg

Jack Campbell began his career in education as a high school biology teacher at a private high school in Columbus. He transitioned into higher education in 1983 when he was appointed to the position of registrar at Cedarville University. With strong interest in the developing computer technologies, Jack introduced the first personal computer to the University in the office of the registrar. His ability to organize and manage systems and apply new software technologies laid the foundation for Cedarville University to be among the first colleges to implement online grading and registration systems. After a five year break, Jack returned to the registrar profession, beginning with a brief stay at Wilmington College and then moving to Wittenberg University where he has served as registrar for the past 14

years. Throughout his career, Jack has enjoyed a strong connection to OACRAO. He has served as a member of the Information Systems and Data Management Committee and the Government Relations committees and he has presented a number of workshops at annual meetings.

Jack is being recognized at a farewell reception on June 28 from 3-5pm in Recitation Hall on the Wittenberg University campus.
