Don't miss your chance to get involved in Government Relations!

In June, OACRAO members will have a special chance to get more involved in the government relations committee and to make an impact on policies and practices at schools across the state, including your own.

This year's Residency Workshop on Friday, June 6, is broken into three sections. The first portion of the day will be specifically designed for new residency counselors and evaluators. This will be a chance to hear from experts **who will provide some basic "how-to" information on determining Ohio residency for tuition purposes.** The mid-section of the workshop will have the format of a traditional residency workshop where a panel of experts, including a representative from the Ohio Board of Regents, will talk through case studies and questions presented by the audience.

The last section of the workshop is specific to this year's schedule. Former OACRAO President, Connie Goodman, will facilitate a discussion among participants and the Board of Regents on best practices. This will be an opportunity to develop best practices, definitions, and consistent policies across all Ohio institutions. Further, it will be an opportunity to make recommendations to the Ohio Board of Regents (and Ohio Legislature) on improvements to the Ohio tuition residency process. **If you can't attend the meeting and have ideas that you'd like to share,** please let [Connie Goodman](#) or [Jack Miner](#) know.
