

AACRAO in Action

AACRAO on the Hill

The AACRAO Board of Directors, including Ohio State University Registrar & Executive Director of Enrollment Services, Jack Miner, launched a new initiative last month. Board members spent the day in Washington, DC with US Representatives and US Senators and their staff sharing information about new legislation that was proposed that day.

Rep. Messer (R-IN) & Rep. Polis (D-CO) introduced the Reverse Transfer Efficiency Act of 2017 (H.R. 3774). H.R. 3774 goes hand in hand with the national imperative to increase U.S. college completion rates and has great support from AACRAO members, member institutions, and state higher education organizations.



The State of Ohio has been a champion in the area of Reverse Transfer and Ohio public 2-year and 4-year institutions as well as some private institutions participate. "Too often, transfer students are walking away from college without a degree," Rep. Luke Messer said. "Our bill will make it easier for transfer students to combine credits and get a degree they've earned, even when life gets in the way. An associate's degree can be a game changer, and help more Hoosiers get a better job and earn higher pay." H.R. 3774 will create a new exemption under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) that will help community colleges determine who is eligible to receive an associate's degrees through the reverse transfer process.

Jack Miner, AACRAO's Vice President for Finance, said "this was an incredible opportunity to connect the AACRAO membership with Congressional leadership on an issue that is important to our schools and offices. I am looking forward to finding opportunities for a larger group of AACRAO members to engage with their elected officials."
